NAPLAN NVCCS

NAPLAN Information for Year 9- Current Year 10's 2017 (extracted from ACARA (2016 NAPLAN) Results

Last week students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sat for their NAPLAN exams. The results will be released later this year. One of the key objectives of NVCCS is to have excellence in the teaching and learning process. The 2016 results for Year 9 students (current Year 10s) indicate the majority of students are increasing in their knowledge and understanding in key learning areas.

In 2016, on average, our students at a Year 9 level were performing more than 40% better than across Australia as a whole in Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation, and Numeracy. Like many schools across NSW writing is a targeted area of improvement, with measures being put in place to ensure that this becomes an added strength of the school.

In reading 84.6% of students achieved greater than or equal to expected growth.

In Writing 61.4....

In Grammar and Punctuation 61.5%


In Numeracy 53.8%

A high percentage of students demonstrated the expected growth between Year 7 & 9 in Reading, Writing, Grammar and Punctuation, and Numeracy.

The following graphs compare NVCCS students performance with schools that have a similar Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA). ICSEA values were created to enable meaningful comparisons of NAPLAN achievements. There are 15 very similar schools across Australia.

Key factors in in identifying similar school are the students' family backgrounds (parents' occupation, school education and non-school education), a school's geographical location and the proportion of Indigenous students a school caters for.

HSC MINIMUM STANDARD ADVICE FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 9 STUDENTS 2017

In 2020, your child will need to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to qualify for a Higher school Certificate (HSC).

PRACTICAL LITERACY AND NUMERCAY SKILLS

The minimum standard will ensure that your child is ready for further education and training, employment and life after school. It is a nationally agreed standard of functional literacy and numeracy.

It means students can do things like:

- Find the time and date of a music concert on an online ticket website;
- Calculate the quantity of paint required to paint a room;
- Estimate distance, travel time and costs for a transport route;
- * Take notes from a lecture or training session;
- Create a personal weekly budget in a spreadsheet;
- Write a job application letter;
- Measure quantities to follow a recipe;
- Follow safety instructions in an equipment manual;
- Enter data in a computer-based management system.

MULTIPLE OPPORTUNIES TO MEET THE STANDARD

Your child will show that they have met the standard by passing new online reading, writing and numeracy tests.

They will take the online tests at school. Your child can take the tests up to twice in a year in:

- ✓ Year 10
- ✓ Year 12
- ☑ For up to five years after they start their first HSC course.

Students can take the tests from next year when they are in Year 10.

YEAR 9 NAPLAN: A CHANCE TO PREQUALIFY FOR THE STANDARD

Your child can prequalify for the standard by achieving Band 8 or above in the Year 9 NAPLAN reading, writing and numeracy tests this year. This means that they won't have to take the online tests.

It is important for you to know that not all students are expected to achieve Band 8 in their year 9 NAPLAN tests this year.

No student will be excluded from sitting for the HSC on the basis of their Year 9 NAPLAN results.

Your child will not be stopped from getting the HSC on the basis of their Year 9 NAPLAN results.

Your child's literacy and numeracy skills will continue to develop and it is expected that they will meet the standard either by the end of Year 10, Year 11 or Year 12.
